Can you help us grow our fund so that we can better support the programs and projects


that make Powers Lake and this whole region great? Consider setting up a recurring gift online or send a check to our address below.

- **Donate mineral acres** outright, assignment of mineral royalty income, or make the Powers Lake Community Foundation an income or remainder beneficiary of your mineral trust.
- Take advantage of the IRA Charitable Rollover through the North Dakota Foundation (NDCF), Community which manages our fund. You can transfer up to \$100,000 if you are over 70 1/2 to NDCF (for the Powers Lake Community Foundation), the donation will count as your Required Minimum Distribution, and you don't have to pay income tax on the amount transferred.

Don't Forget About the Tax Credit

The North Dakota Charitable Income Tax Credit, passed by the ND State Legislature in 2011, allows individuals that donate \$5,000 or more and businesses that donate any amount to qualified endowment funds to receive up to a 40% state tax credit.

Depending on your tax bracket, this means a \$5,000 gift to PLCF may end up only costing about \$2,000 after taking advantage of the tax credit and other deductions! (see chart below)
