#### \$22,300 Awarded in 2022

- Little Flower Catholic School: \$7,500 for additional technology and flooring
- Village Arts, Inc.: \$5,800 for a stage curtain purchase
- Rugby Lions Club: \$3,000 to support their summer Music in the Park series
- Tri-County Senior Meals & Services: \$2,000 for Nutrition Services for the elderly
- Rugby Chamber of Commerce: \$1,500 to update the informational kiosk at the Geographical Center Monument
- Pierce County Food Pantry: \$1,500 to support their 2022 Christmas food baskets
- Rugby's Dolly Parton's Imagination Library: \$1,000 to continue providing books to children ages 0-5

#### **Philanthropy in Many Forms**

The Rugby Community Endowment Fund (RCEF) is one of several funds at the North Dakota Community Foundation that support the Rugby area, including

- Little Flower Fund I: established in 1981 to financially assist the Little Flower School in Rugby
- The Rugby High School Alumni Scholarship Fund: established in 1985 to provide scholarships to graduating seniors of Rugby High School who are pursuing a post-secondary education.
- Little Flower Fund II: established in in 1992 to provide income to the Little Flower School, and the Little Flower Church if the School should close.
- The Rugby Public School Foundation Non-Endowment Fund, established in 2022 to support the ongoing needs of the Rugby Public School system.

Donations can be made to any of the funds listed above at any time at NDCF.net/Donate.

In addition, individuals or families can establish other funds to support the organizations, schools, communities or charities they would like. Other types of funds at NDCF include:

- Donor-Advised Funds: the donor or their designee(s) recommends grant awards every year.
- Special Purpose Funds: the donor specifies when the fund is created which organizations should receive the grant dollars and NDCF carries out their wishes every year.
- Organizational Endowment: an endowment fund that benefits one particular organization to further their mission (such as the Little Flower Funds above).

All of the endowed funds at NDCF are managed

as "qualified North Dakota endowment funds" and gifts may qualify for the State 40% Income Tax Credit. Contact Kara Geiger at Kara@NDCF.net or 701-222-8349 for more information about any of these funds, the tax credit, or options for establishing a new fund.
