The Adams County Community Foundation awarded two grants from its endowment fund earnings in October:

- **Hettinger Park District:** \$3,000 for Hettinger Golf Course updates
- Adams County Food Pantry: \$980 to purchase food items for the pantry

Grant applications are accepted once a year and reviewed by the local Advisory Committee.


Fund Growth Over the Years

The Adams County Community Foundation has a market value of more than \$184,000!

How did we get to this amount? Our fund was established by the Adams County Development Corporation in 2015 and received its first gift a few months later - \$10,000 from Allete Clean Energy.

In 2019, our community began to embrace the idea of a permanent charitable resource and since then 26 different businesses and individuals have made gifts to this fund, many of them making multiple donations over the years.

The chart below shows the market value of our fund on December 31 of every year.
