\$6,144 Awarded in 2022

The Hebron Area Community Foundation awarded \$6,144 in three different grants in April of this year:

- **Hebron Ambulance Service:** \$5,000 towards the purchase of a new ambulance



- **Hebron Public School:**
 - \$596.40 for a driving simulator
 - \$547.60 for cross country warm-up uniforms

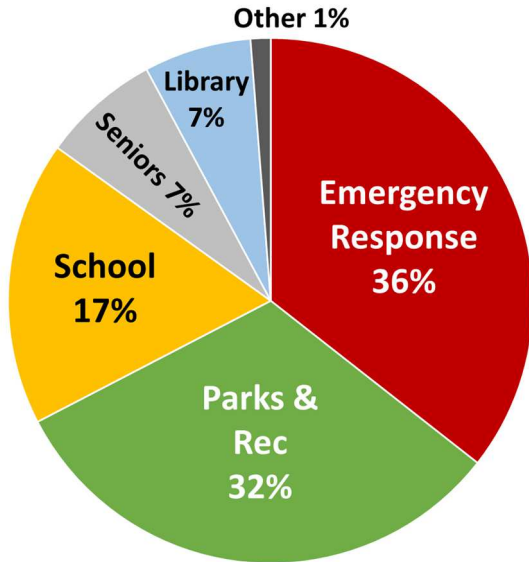

Real North Dakotans Making a Difference In Their Community

Making a lasting difference in your community or for future generations may be easier than you realize. With very simple language in your will or trust, you can support the Hebron Area Community Foundation (HACF) and continue to provide resources for projects and programs well into the future.

Other North Dakotans have left a legacy in their community:

- Tom Larson was the City Manager, Assessor, and Auditor for Park River, ND and a tremendous community leader. When he passed away at the age of 54, he left almost \$120,000 to the Park River Community Endowment Fund.
- T.A. and Anna Solheim left 50% of their estate to their heirs and certain percentages of their estate to various nonprofit organizations, including 15% to the Minot community.
- Brothers Russell and Dale Brown left gifts to the communities of Lisbon and Milnor in their estate plans.
