Wow - Grid United's donation to Grant County is nothing short of amazing (see article on back). This gift will make a significant impact on the residents of our communities.

The donation from Grid United was the impetus for the establishment of the Grant County Community Foundation at the North Dakota Community Foundation (NDCF). Our community foundation's advisory committee will review grant applications and make recommendations for grant awards from the Grid United gift. But in order to create a long-lasting legacy for our area, we would also like to create an endowed fund to support projects in Grant County in perpetuity.

NDCF has over 70 community foundations in North Dakota under their umbrella. Some of them have over \$1 million in assets and award \$40,000 *every year* to projects in their area. We would like to start a permanent fund like that for Grant County. Start now, grow over time, and create a permanent resource for our area in the future.

\$64,000 Awarded in Grants Second Grant Round Due Oct. 31

The Grant County Community Foundation (GCCF) awarded the following grants in August:

- New Leipzig Fireman's Auxiliary: \$32,000 toward a Cascade System and Air Packs
- Elgin Fire Protection District: \$20,000 for turnout gear replacement
- Kidz Clubhouse: \$12,000 for improvement projects

Because of the Grid United gift, there will be a second grant round with applications due on October 31st. There is \$65,000 available in the fall grant round

Any organization with a 501(c)(3) status or government agency that provides services in Grant County may apply for a grant. More information and the online application process can be accessed at www.NDCF.net/ GrantCounty. ◊



Grid United Provides Significant Grant Dollars to Area

Grid United, an independent transmission company that builds new long-distance, interregional transmission lines, is providing significant grant dollars to the Grant County Community Foundation for the 2023 granting The Grid United money, from their season. Community Investment Program (CIP) at the North Dakota Community Foundation, will support the six North Dakota counties in which Grid United's North Plains Connector - a transmission line connecting the U.S. eastern and western electric grids in Montana and North Dakota - will be located.





The portion of the gift that is designated for Grant County will be granted in two different grant rounds as follows:

- Summer Round (already awarded see article on front): \$64,000
- Fall Round (applications due by October 31): **\$65,000**

Eligible projects must have a broad impact on the quality of life for a significant number of people Ineligible projects include in Grant County. religious, partisan, or sectarian programs along with one-time events that are not part of longerterm economic and community development goals. Grants will not be awarded to individuals.

"We aim to foster long-term partnerships with the communities in which we develop projects and look forward to helping address community needs in Grant County," said Michael Skelly, Chief Executive Officer of Grid United.

Growing for the Future

While the Grid United donation is an incredible gift to our area, it is to be granted immediately and will not have any impact on future needs. In order to have money available for projects in the future (or maintenance needs for existing projects), we want to grow an endowment fund, which is invested and generates grantable dollars every year from its earnings.

- Take advantage of the IRA Charitable Rollover - you can transfer money directly to NDCF (for GCCF). The donated amount your Required Minimum counts as Distribution, but you don't need to claim it as federal income.
- Make NDCF the beneficiary of your will, trust, retirement account, or life insurance policy. Suggested verbiage is below:

"I give and bequeath to the North Dakota Community Foundation (Tax ID 45-0336015), a qualified charitable organization under IRS 501 (c)(3), located in Bismarck, North Dakota, (a percentage, specific dollar amount, or remainder) to the Grant County Community Foundation, a component fund of the North Dakota Community Foundation."
