Foundation, who works with area producers on their gifts. *"Farmers can deduct the cost of production, but the portion of the harvest that is donated does not have to be claimed as income to the self-employed farmer. This can result in thousands of dollars in tax savings as opposed to a straight gift of cash."*

# Leave a Legacy in Richardton


If you would like to leave some or all of your estate to the Richardton Area Community Foundation, the bequest language is as follows:
