If you have children or other relatives, you can leave a portion of your estate to them and a percentage to GAF. Doing so provides for your heirs while honoring your charitable values.


Other North Dakotans have left a legacy in their community:

This can result in thousands of dollars in tax savings as opposed to a straight gift of cash."
