\$13,500 Awarded in 2018

The Richardton Area Community Foundation was created to be a resource to support local community initiatives which provide a higher quality of life in Richardton and Taylor. This year, the Richardton ACF Advisory Committee awarded a total of \$13,500 in 3 different grants to the following organizations and projects:

- PAWS (Richardton-Taylor School District): \$6,000 towards a multi-purpose outdoor court
- Richardton Park District: \$5,000 towards a new 50'x60' outdoor basketball court in the center of town
- American Legion Post 180: \$2,500 for an electrical update to meet building codes

Grants are awarded once a year. Any organization with a 501(c)(3) status or government agency may apply. Applications are available online at www.NDCF.net/Richardton. ◊



The new multi-purpose outdoor court near the newly constructed Richardton-Taylor Public School includes a concrete pad with basketball hoops, lights, a volleyball net and other amenities. It is used by students and the community at large and was partially funded by a \$6,000 grant from the Richardton Area Community Foundation.

Ways To Give: Options to Grow Our Fund

There are many easy ways to support our community's permanent endowment fund:


Write a check every year on your birthday. Together, these gifts from area residents would grow our fund into a huge resource for our school, park district, and other nonprofit organizations!



- **Establish a Charitable Gift** Annuity through the North Dakota Community Foundation, which manages our fund. You will receive an annual payment for the rest of your life, and the Richardton Area Community Foundation will get the remainder of your gift when you are gone.
- Leave a gift in your will. You can designate a certain dollar amount, a percentage of your estate, or the remainder of your estate after other gifts have been made to your family or friends.
- Donate agricultural produce. This is an easy way to give without having to open your checkbook! Producers don't have to claim the income from the sale and they can still deduct the cost of production for whatever they donate.
- Make the fund a full or partial beneficiary of your life insurance policy.
- Make a gift in memory of a loved one.
- Businesses: donate a percentage of your net profit at the end of the year. Having a strong community with valuable services for residents improves our quality of life and is good for business!
- Take advantage of the tax credit. Businesses that give any amount and individuals that donate at least \$5,000 in one calendar year to the Richardton Area Community Foundation are eligible for the state's 40% income tax credit. This can make a big difference at tax time - talk to your financial advisor. ◊
