\$3,000 Awarded in 2024

The Killdeer Area Community Foundation Advisory Committee awarded \$3,000 to CHI -Health Connect at Home to help purchase Home Health and Hospice fleet vehicles in 2024.

"We serve clients in Dunn County specifically in Marshall, Killdeer, Manning, Halliday, Dunn Center, and Dodge and cover a radius of 60 miles from Dickinson," wrote Joel Babcock in the grant application.

"Currently, staff drive personal vehicles seeing Home Health and Hospice clients in their personal homes or in nursing homes. CHI Health at Home needs reliable vehicles that function year round in all conditions, on all types of roads, and any time day or night. With reliable vehicles we want to provide staff with better personal safety as well as being more secure/confident in meeting every client's appointment. Homebound clients require our services and are dependent on staff making it to their homes."



Give Other Than or In Addition to Cash?

Why, yes you can! The Killdeer Area Community Foundation can accept many different types of gifts. Depending on your situation, you may want to consider donating one of the following:

- **Gifts of farm commodities:** Avoid income recognition by having the elevator make a direct transfer to the Killdeer Area Community Foundation.
- **Real estate**, which allows the donor to deduct the current appraised value of the real estate and avoid capital gains taxes.
- **Depreciated business property** (farm equipment, etc.) Avoids recapture tax.
- Appreciated investment assets, valued on the date of transfer, are tax deductible and you can avoid paying capital gains tax.
- Over 70 1/2? A charitable IRA rollover counts as your required minimum distribution, but you don't need to claim the donated portion as federal income. Must be sent to NDCF by direct transfer.
- **Gifts of mineral** acres outright, assignment of mineral royalty income, or make the Killdeer Area Community Foundation an income or remainder beneficiary of your family mineral trust.
