## \$4,813 Awarded in 2019

The Bowman & Slope County Community Foundation Advisory Committee awarded a total of \$4,813 to the following projects and programs:

- \$2,000 to Bowman County School District for benchmark assessment and leveled books
- \$2,000 to Southwest Healthcare Services for COPE2Thrive (Creating Opportunities for Personal Empowerment)
- \$813 to the Bowman Regional Public Library for materials to create a Calm Down Corner

Grants are awarded from the fund's earnings, usually once a year. Any organization with a 501(c)(3) status or government agency in Bowman or Slope Counties may apply.

Applications are available online at **www.NDCF.net/BowmanSlope** and are due by September 15 every year. The local advisory committee will have over \$6,000 to award in 2020.

### **Calm Down Corner Soothes**

Sometimes it's the small additions or improvements that make a big difference for an organization. Take, for example, the new Calm Down Corner at the Bowman Regional Public Library, which was added last fall. The area was suggested during a partnership meeting between Bowman/Slope Multi-County Social Services and the Library Board.

"A calm down corner or mindfulness corner is a place for angry and upset children to go to engage their minds, release their anger and regulate their emotions," explained Sarah Snavely, Library Director in her grant



application. Major components of a calm down corner include a comforting space with sensory, calming and engaging activities.

The library was granted \$813 from the Bowman/ Slope Community Foundation during their 2019 grant round to purchase a Magis Spin Chair and a variety of other calm-down tools.

According to Snavely, the Calm Down Corner has performed exactly as expected. "Children (and many adults too!) have experienced the Magis Spin chair and the Calm Down corner," she noted. "One little boy marched across the library to the Calm Down Corner saying, 'I need to spin and spin and chill out!' He did just that, then continued with our Tuesday Afternoon Board games. When the game got too stressful for him and he was feeling overwhelmed, he stopped himself from shouting and instead said, 'I need five more minutes in the spinny chair!'"

Snavely noted that librarians have seen a decrease in the intense behaviors previously exhibited. The children know what the corner is for and they appreciate the tactile toys. The Sequin Stuffed Hedgehog is the most popular one.

"Many adults have used the Calm Down Corner as well," says Snavely. "They come into the library, sit in the chair and spin. Then they laugh. That's the best thing - breaking through the stress and anxiety with hearty laughter."

- 2. Click on the "Donate" button on that page.
- 3. Choose "Recurring Donation Amount" and fill in the amount of money you wish to donate every month.
- 4. Follow the instructions to complete the checkout process.

You will receive a tax receipt for your donation and you can change the amount or frequency of your gifts at any time.
