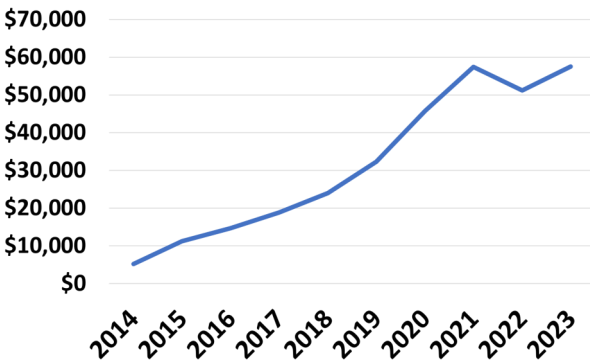

Fund Growth Over the Years

The Emerado Community Endowment Fund has a market value of over \$57,000! This is a permanent fund so that money will provide grant dollars for our area forever.

How did we get to this amount? First, a group of local residents had the forethought to create this fund at the North Dakota Community Foundation back in 2014. Then, a group of dedicated volunteers successfully created and grew the Emerado Corn Feed - our signature community event that raises money every year for our permanent fund. Numerous local individuals and families have been making additional gifts to this fund for several years to help it grow and since our fund is invested in the stock market, we have also seen growth in our value through careful investing!

The chart below shows the **market value of our fund on December 31 every year** since it started (The 2023 number is as of December, 6, 2023.)



The larger our fund, the more and larger grants we can award every year to local projects and programs including those at our school, museum, fire department, and city. There are many ways to grow our fund, including a gift in your will, and there are many benefits to donating to our fund, including the state’s 40% income tax credit and the IRA Charitable Rollover.

Generous Tax Credit Provides Big Incentive To Give

Are you able to make a more substantial gift to our community foundation? If so, you may be interested in the significant tax benefits available to you.

The North Dakota Charitable Income Tax Credit, passed by the ND State Legislature in 2011, allows individuals that donate \$5,000 or more and businesses that donate any amount to qualified endowment funds to receive up to a 40% state tax credit.

The Emerado Community Endowment Fund (ECEF) is managed as a “qualified endowment fund” so donations may qualify for the tax credit if they meet the above criteria. Several donors have already taken advantage of this incentive and contributed to our fund.

Depending on your tax bracket, this means a \$5,000 gift to the ECEF may end up only costing about \$2,000 after taking advantage of the tax credit and other deductions! (see chart below)

Gift Amount	\$5,000	\$10,000	\$25,000

Leave Your Legacy in Emerado

If you would like to leave some or all of your estate, insurance policy, or retirement account to the Emerado Community Endowment Fund, the bequest language is as follows:

*“I give and bequeath to the North Dakota Community Foundation (Tax ID 45-0336015), a qualified charitable organization under IRS 501 (c)(3), located in Bismarck, North Dakota, _____ (a percentage, specific dollar amount, or remainder) to the **Emerado Community Endowment Fund**, a component fund of the North Dakota Community Foundation.”*
