## **\$2,600 Awarded in 2024**

Powers Lake Community Foundation awarded a total of \$2,600 in two different grants to the following organizations in October of 2024:

- Powers Lake School: \$1,970 for Ag Ed equipment upgrades
- Powers Lake Food Pantry: \$630 for food

"The grant money will be used to buy turkeys and hams for Thanksgiving and Christmas," wrote Elizabeth Bolen in the food pantry's application. "This will help feed 127 people in the Powers lake community.'



### **Fund Growth Over the Years**

The Powers Lake Community Foundation has grown significantly in the last two years and now has a market value of more than \$170,000!

How did we get to this amount? The foundation was started in 2019 to provide a permanent charitable resource for our area by a group of concerned residents. Several people made significant contributions that first year to get us started. The Powers Lake Area Development contributed a substantial amount in 2021 as an investment in our future and we have seen significant donations from many area residents since then. In fact, 25 different families, businesses, and individuals have made a gift of some kind to this fund, and some of them have made several donations over the years!

The chart below shows the growth of our fund since its inception in 2019 through November 21, 2024.



There are many ways to grow our fund and we can accept a variety of gifts, including stock transfers, real estate, and donations of agricultural commodities (see article at right.)

## Give Other Than or In Addition to Cash?

Why, yes you can! The Powers Lake Community Foundation can accept many different types of gifts. Depending on your situation, you may want to consider donating one of the following:

- Gifts of farm commodities: Avoid income recognition by having the elevator make a direct transfer to the Powers Lake Community Foundation Endowment.
- Real estate, which allows the donor to deduct the current appraised value of the real estate and avoid capital gains taxes.
- Depreciated business property (farm equipment, etc.) Avoids recapture tax.
- Appreciated investment assets, valued on the date of transfer, are tax deductible and you can avoid paying capital gains tax.
- Over 70 1/2? A charitable IRA rollover counts as your required minimum distribution, but you don't need to claim the donated portion as federal income. Must be sent to NDCF by direct transfer.
- Gifts of mineral acres outright, assignment of mineral royalty income, or make the Powers Lake Community Foundation an income or remainder beneficiary of your family mineral trust.
