\$6,439 Awarded in 2022

The New England Community Foundation (NECF) awarded two grants totaling \$6,439 in May of 2022 to the following organizations:

- **New England Public School:** \$4,039 for the New England Basketball Camp
- **Hettinger County 4-H Council:** \$2,400 for archery targets and other equipment to host a district shooting competition

"Currently, the Southwest District competition is held in Mandan and had 360 youth registered this year," wrote Myra Klein in the grant application. *"With the growing interest of the archery program in Hettinger County and the surrounding counties of the Southwest portion of the state, it has been suggested that New England host the Southwest district competition in 2023. The equipment that is in New England cannot support the large numbers needed to put on a successful district match. This equipment would also be used to host "fun" matches, as well."*

Grants are awarded once a year. Any organization with a 501(c)(3) status or government agency may apply. Applications are available online at www.NDCF.net/ NewEngland and are due by March 31.

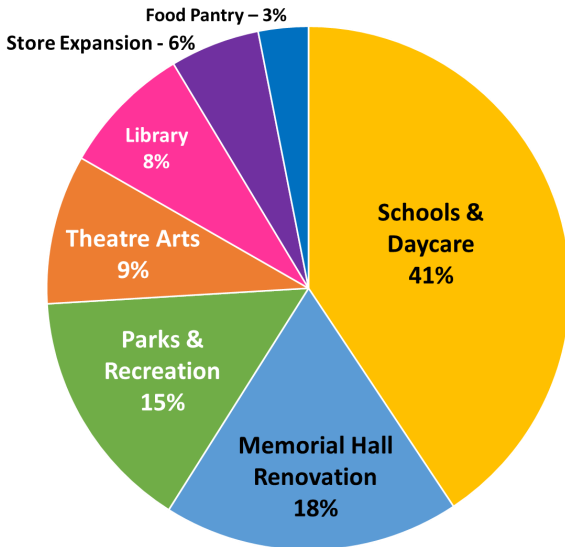

- Brothers Russell and Dale Brown left gifts to the communities of Lisbon and Milnor in their estate plans.
